When you care for someone in the church, *Jesus is caring for them through you*

Then Peter said to them, “Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. **Acts 2:38 NKJV**

We must learn to decide whether to merely follow our own desires or to live in a way that honors God. This month we will help our toddler see from the story of Noah that to choose fellowship with the God who loves them is far better.

Memory Verse: "God keeps us safe." Psalm 4:8 (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: I'm Glad that God Keeps Us Safe

Parent Engagement: Admire your toddler's adorable rainbow craft from today (this is one of our favorite toddler crafts!). Help your toddler point to each color on the rainbow collage and say the color name. Remind your toddler that God gave Noah a rainbow to promise him that he would keep him safe. Remind your toddler of our heart of the lesson this past month, **God keeps us safe**. If your kid didn't get to come to church today, you can make this craft at home with strips of paper and a glue stick!

Parent Engagement: Have your kids retell you the story using their craft. Then go over their new memory verse together. How was God with Daniel? What are fears you have and how can God help you?
