God tested Abraham to surrender his son

Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." - Genesis 22:1 NKJV

Then He said, "Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." -

Genesis 22:2 NKJV

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. - **John 3:16 NKJV**

God tested Abraham to believe His promise

So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son; and he split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. - **Genesis 22:3 NKJV**

Then on the third day Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off. - Genesis 22:4 NKJV

And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the lad and I will go yonder and worship, and we will come back to you." - **Genesis 22:5 NKJV**

So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid *it* on Isaac, his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife, and the two of them went together. - **Genesis 22:6 NKJV**

By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises offered up his only begotten son, - **Hebrews 11:17 NKJV**

of whom it was said, "In Isaac your seed shall be called," - Hebrews 11:18 NKJV

concluding that God *was* able to raise *him* up, even from the dead, from which he also received him in a figurative sense. - **Hebrews 11:19 NKJV**

God tested Isaac to lay down his life

But Isaac spoke to Abraham, his father and said, "My father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." Then he said, "Look, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" - Genesis 22:7 NKJV

And Abraham said, "My son, God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering." So the two of them went together. - **Genesis 22:8 NKJV**

Then they came to the place of which God had told him. And Abraham built an altar there and placed the wood in order; and he bound Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, upon the wood.
Genesis 22:9 NKJV

And Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. - Genesis 22:10 NKJV

Therefore My Father loves Me, because I lay down My life that I may take it again. - John 10:17 NKJV

Abraham and Isaac's story pictures the sacrifice of Christ

But the Angel of the Lord called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" So he said, "Here I am." - Genesis 22:11 NKJV

And He said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me." - Genesis 22:12 NKJV

Then Abraham lifted his eyes and looked, and there behind *him was* a ram caught in a thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram, and offered it up for a burnt offering instead of his son. - **Genesis 22:13 NKJV**

And Abraham called the name of the place, The-Lord-Will-Provide; as it is said *to* this day, "In the Mount of the Lord it shall be provided." - **Genesis 22:14 NKJV**

Moriah, where this story takes place, is believed to be where Jerusalem would eventually be built? Wow! Think about it, God really did provide by sending not only the ram in today's story but his son Jesus to die for us in this very same place!
