

<u>How God Sees our Generosity Today – Part 1 (2 Corinthians 8)</u> Sunday, November 9, 2025


For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. Luke 12:34 NKJV

God owns everything Money is a tool Loving money is evil

"The many listeners to this message who haven't yet committed to sacrificial generosity NEED to know that joy comes from giving! They don't know what they're missing!"

Moreover, brethren, we make known to you the grace of God bestowed on the churches of Macedonia: 2 Corinthians 8:1 NKJV

that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality. 2 Corinthians 8:2 NKJV

For I bear witness that according to their ability, yes, and beyond their ability, they were freely willing, 2 Corinthians 8:3 NKJV

imploring us with much urgency that we would receive the gift and the fellowship of the ministering to the saints. 2 Corinthians 8:4 NKJV

And in this I give advice: It is to your advantage not only to be doing what you began and were desiring to do a year ago; 2 Corinthians 8:10 NKJV

but now you also must complete the doing of it; that as there was a readiness to desire it, so there also may be a completion out of what you have. 2 Corinthians 8:11 NKJV

God sees giving as the result of giving your life to Him

And not only as we had hoped, but they first gave themselves to the Lord, and then to us by the will of God. 2 Corinthians 8:5 NKJV

"Generosity is the natural sacrificial response of one who has received God's love & grace."

God sees giving as a key to your growth in Him

So we urged Titus, that as he had begun, so he would also complete this grace in you as well. 2 Corinthians 8:6 NKJV

But as you abound in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all diligence, and in your love for us—see that you abound in this grace also. 2 Corinthians 8:7 NKJV

God sees giving as proof of your love for Him

I speak not by commandment, but I am testing the sincerity of your love by the diligence of others. 2 Corinthians 8:8 NKJV




God sees giving as who your Lord is

Memory Verse: "We thank God." Psalm 107:1 (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: We Thank God for Family and Friends

Parent Connect: Take turns sharing which family and friends your family is thankful for and why. Spend time as a family in prayer thanking God for those family and friends.



In this series, we will learn about Daniel in the Lion's Den, Esther, and the Israelites rebuilding the temple and how each person required courage to stand up for God's way. God gives us courage!

Memory Verse: "So be strong and courageous, all you who put your hope in the Lord!" Psalm 31:24

Heart of the Lesson: Trust God | Esther 1-5:1-4

Parent Connect: This week, we began to learn about Queen Esther. As a family this week read Esther 1-5:1-4 or the story of Esther in a storybook Bible. Talk to your kid about who Esther was and why she had to Trust God!



God gives! God's generosity is one of the key themes that runs throughout the entire Bible. From God giving us life in Genesis to God giving us His one and only son in the New Testament, in this series, we are going to explore generosity in our own lives using what God has already given us.

Memory Verse: You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully." 2 Corinthians 9:7

Heart of the Lesson: God gives us a role to play | Ephesians 4

Parent Connect: We have each been uniquely crafted by God with special traits and talents to serve our church. Talk as a family about what makes you special and then have a movie night to watch the "God Made You Special" episode of VeggieTales. Talk about how God has made us individually to serve our church and he loves us, very much.



God gives generously. He gave us everything, and our generosity is a response of thankfulness for who He is and everything He has done. What does it look like for a 5th-6th grade student to be generous with their time, talents, and treasures? How does God want us to share Him with those around us and those around the world? In this series, we'll explore what it means to live generously, giving because God first gave to us.

Memory Verse: "And God will generously provide all you need. Then you will always have everything you need and plenty left over to share with others." 2 Corinthians 9:8

Heart of the Lesson: God gives us a role to play - Acts 14:21-23, Acts 28:16-23

Parent Connect: Today we talked about some different roles people have in the church and in God's mission: Welcomers, Pray-ers, Goers, Senders, Mobilizers, and Encouragers. Ask your student what they remember about each one and what role they might see themselves having right now or in the future.
