GOD SEES US



For the next four weeks your toddler will be learning that God sees us. The kids will use their 5 senses to learn about Jonah's amazing adventures with the great fish and to learn that God sees us all the time. Rain or shine, night or day, God sees us when we work and play! God says he will never look away.

Memory Verse: God sees us. Job 31:4 (adapted for toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: God Sees Us All the Time

Parent Engagement: Add water to a shallow container. Place various sized scoops, measuring cups, smaller containers, even a pasta strainer in the tub of water. Let your toddler explore with the water and containers. Ask your toddler if he/she remembers the water in this weekend's story. God saw Jonah and God sees us, too!

SAMUEL AND THE KINGS



A WALK THROUGH THE HIGH POINTS OF THE BOOKS OF SAMUEL, 1ST AND 2ND KINGS

This month we are learning about the first two kings of Israel. They were two very different kinds of kings. Saul was afraid, didn't trust God and disobeyed. David was brave, did trust God and mostly obeyed. We want our kids to know they have choices too but life is better if we decide to trust and obey God. Just look at how Saul and David's life turned out.

Memory Verse: The LORD doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart 1 Samuel 16:7b

Heart of the Lesson: David and Goliath - 1 Samuel 17

Parent Engagement: Make a target (maybe a Goliath face), roll up a wad of paper and try to hit it. David wasn't afraid of a giant because he knew God was with him. What are you afraid of and how can you ask God to help?

Kids are mirroring the parenting series but through their eyes. We are challenging them to think of their physical and spiritual families. What legacy do they come from? How are they connecting, growing and then going as a family? What legacy do they want to leave? This is a great series to ask your kids what they are learning and engage in spiritual conversations.

Memory Verse: "I remember your genuine faith, for you share the faith that first filled your grandmother Lois and your mother, Eunice. And I know that same faith continues strong in you." 2 Timothy 1:5

Heart of the Lesson: What is your physical and spiritual family Legacy? 2 Timothy 1:2,5

Parent Engagement: Work together to fill out the family tree sheet your kid brought home. Develop a family mission statement together
