Memory Verse: "God Made Me" Genesis 1:27-28

Heart of the Lesson: God Made Me in His Image

Parent Connect: Today we learned that God made each of us in his image. Today's craft was an (unbreakable) mirror. Encourage your toddler to look in the mirror and say, "God Made Me."



In this series we will learn about Israel's first king, Saul and a great king, David. God taught both kings important lessons while they were ruling the Israelites.

Memory Verse: "The LORD doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." 1 Samuel 16:7b

Heart of the Lesson: David and Jonathan Are Friends | 1 Samuel 18:1-4, 20

Parent Connect: Today we learned how David and Jonathan became friends and how Jonathan gave David very important gifts. Talk to your kid about something that is important to them; a rock, a toy, a book. Talk about sharing that item with a friend or a family member just like Jonathan and David.



Heart of the Lesson: God's Name is Special/Keep His Name Special - Matthew 6:9-13B; Matthew 6:9b; Exodus 20:7

Parent Connect: Holy means set apart. Find one mundane object and one that is obviously different. An example might be a scrap of paper and an apple. Talk about how they are different, how the apple can provide things like nutrition and health, while the scrap of paper can only be thrown in the trash. The benefit of the apple lasts longer than the scrap of paper.





In this series, we will be following along with the Adults to walk through The Lord's Prayer. We will go through the prayer verse by verse, learning about the example Jesus gives, how it applies to our lives and how we can pray. Students will also learn how to implement and practice the practical tips that Jesus shares: asking for forgiveness, praising God in prayer, thanking Him for supplying for our needs, praying for His kingdom to come and His will to be done.

Memory Verse: Pray like this: Our Father in heaven, may your name be kept holy. May your Kingdom come soon. May your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us today the food we need, and forgive us our sins, as we have forgiven those who sin against us. And don't let us yield to temptation but rescue us from the evil one. Matthew 6:9-13

Heart of the Lesson: God's kingdom is coming-Matthew 6:10

Parent Connect: Today we talked about the Matthew 6:10 and God's kingdom that is coming. Go on a walk in your neighborhood as a family and pray this verse over your neighbors, and school. "Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Matthew 6:10"

SPECIAL NEEDS ADULTS THE LORD'S PRAYER

Just like we want to talk to our close friends and family, God wants us to talk to Him! Prayer is what we call talking with God. But it can be confusing to know what to pray about! Luckily, Jesus showed us how! This series, we're looking at a sample prayer Jesus prayed to learn how we can pray!

Memory Verse: "This is how you should pray. "'Our Father in heaven, may your name be honored. May your kingdom come. May what you want to happen be done on earth as it is done in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, just as we also have forgiven those who sin against us. Keep us from sinning when we are tempted. Save us from the evil one.' [For yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.] (Matthew 6:9-13)

Heart of the Lesson: Our Father's Kingdom comes first (Matthew 6:33, Luke 22:42, Philippians 3:20)
